St. Thomas More College Ukrainian Awards

Rose Semko Hrynchuk Scholarship

One annual award with a value of up to \$2500.

Open to students who are enrolled in a 200 or 300 level Ukrainian language credit course offered on campus or abroad in the year that the award is granted.

Candidates must have a minimum of 75% overall average in his/her full-time studies including the Ukrainian language class they are enrolled in during the academic year.

The student with the highest academic average who meets the criteria listed above will be awarded the scholarship. No application required.

Ukrainian Self Reliance Association/TYC-Steppe Branch Ukrainian Language Awards

- 2 awards of \$500 each for course UKR 114.3
- 2 awards of \$500 each for course UKR 117.3
- 1 award of \$500 for course UKR 214.3
- 1 award of \$500 for course UKR 217.3

Candidates must maintain a minimum of an 80% average in the course related to the award as well as complete and submit a separate award application.

The student(s) with the highest academic average in the course specific to the award will be the award recipient(s).

Notes: Offered in conjunction with STM courses, these awards are exempt from the requirement that the applicant be a self-declared STM student or actively involved in the life of the STM. At the request of the donor, preference will be given to candidates who self-identify as Ukrainian Orthodox. A separate application will be sent to qualifying students.





University of Saskatchewan Ukrainian Awards

Ludwig, Olga & Constance Kaye Ukrainian Orthodox Millennium Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students who have completed at least 12 credit units of Ukrainian language study and are registered in 3 credit units of a 300-level Ukrainian language course. They must also be involved in Ukrainian cultural work or completed a research project on a Ukrainian family that settled in Saskatchewan prior to World War

Candidates must submit documentation verifying their Ukrainian cultural work, or a copy of the completed research project (whichever is applicable).

Selection will be based on academic achievement in the preceding Regular Session.

Professor and Mrs. J. Rudewsky Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students, who have completed at least 12 credit units of Ukrainian language study or are registered in at least 6 credit units of 200-level Ukrainian language courses.

Selection will be based on academic achievement in all Ukrainian language courses as determined by the Award Committee.

Michael Sytnick Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students who have completed at least one course in Ukrainian and are registered in at least 3 credit units of 300-level Ukrainian language study.

Selection will be based on academic achievement as determined by the Award Committee.

Steven and Katherine Kirstiuk Bursary

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students who are registered in at least 3 credit units of 300-level Ukrainian language courses and who demonstrate financial need as determined by the Award Committee. Candidates must submit documentation verifying financial need.

Selection will be based on financial need, as determined by the Award Committee.

University of Saskatchewan Ukrainian Awards (cont.)

Bayda-Vyshnevetsky Kozaks Society Prize in Ukrainian Studies

One annual award, value based on the financial resources available.

Candidates must be enrolled in a Ukrainian Studies course; registered in or have completed at least 6 credit units of 200-level Ukrainian language study; and submit an essay on any topic related to the Kozak era of Ukrainian history.

Selection will be based on the academic merit of the submitted essay as determined by the Award Committee.

Mohylianky Society Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students who have completed at least 3 credit units of 200-level Ukrainian language study; participated in Ukrainian organizations while a student (documentation required); and are registered in at least 3 credit units of 300-level Ukrainian language study.

Selection will be based on academic achievement as determined by the Award Committee.

Annie Palynchuk Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available.

Open to continuing undergraduate students of Ukrainian descent with preference given to students who have completed at least 12 credit units in Ukrainian courses.

Selection will be based on academic achievement as determined by the Award Committee.

Stephen J. Porayko Scholarship

One annual award, value to be determined by the Award Committee based on the financial resources available

Open to continuing undergraduate students who have completed at least 3 credit units of Ukrainian language study and are registered in at least 3 credit units of 300-level Ukrainian language study.

Selection will be based on academic achievement as determined by the Award Committee.
