# Petro Jacyk Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Ukrainian Studies

## St. Thomas More College at the University of Saskatchewan

Offered at St. Thomas More College (STM) for the academic year of 2021–22, the Petro Jacyk Post-Doctoral Fellowship has been created to support Ukrainian Studies on the University of Saskatchewan campus.

Applications are welcome from scholars in the disciplines of political science and history. Qualified applicants will have received a PhD or are scheduled to receive their degree by July 31, 2021, if they submit confirmatory documents.

The successful applicant will be expected to take up the post-doctoral appointment at STM in the University of Saskatchewan from August 1, 2021 until July 31, 2022.

The fellowship will be held with the Prairie Centre for the Study of Ukrainian Heritage ([pcuh.stmcollege.ca](http://pcuh.stmcollege.ca)) and co-hosted in either the Department of Political Studies or the Department of History.

The Petro Jacyk Post-Doctoral Fellow is expected to:

- *teach two half-courses – the first being a core course within a discipline (Political Studies or History) and another on Ukraine (Political Studies or History).*
- *continue their research on Ukrainian subject matter with a view to publication.*
- *and participate in program activities of the Prairie Centre for the Study of Ukrainian Studies (PCUH) at St. Thomas More College, including the organization of a possible workshop or conference in the area of her/his research.*

This competition is open to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada. The duration of fellowship is for one year. The stipend is CAD 38,000. Benefits and the cost of economy airfare to Saskatoon will be covered. Finally, a research stipend of \$1,500 accompanies the fellowship. The recipient may not hold another fellowship concurrently.

Candidates are asked to submit electronically a vita (and confirmatory documents in the case of a soon-to-be completed PhD), two letters of reference, a description of their proposed research plan (including outcomes) as well as a statement on a possible workshop/conference.
